Program Guidelines

Our Co-op Program caters to students at The College of The Bahamas throughout their course of study which ranges from one to four years provided they meet the minimum Grade Point Average (GPA) set by us.

Co-ops are required to submit transcripts after each semester to ensure that the minimum GPA is being achieved. Failure to maintain and/or submit grades may result in the reduction of co-op hours.

Students are able to set their working hours based on their class schedules and are paid on an hourly basis. Students are able to combine the knowledge learned in the classroom with practical on-the-job experience.
