



Digital transformation with Next Generation EU (NGEU) Programme in Greece

The NGEU programme has presented an opportunity to build a smarter Europe that is able to successfully weather any future crisis. In fact, the EU Commission says at least 20% of Recovery and Resilience Facility funds (RRF) should be spent in digital advancements. A total of 28.53% of RRF funds are to be invested in digital.

The client challenge

A significant mandate of the Ministry of Digital Governance is to digitise and simplify daily interactions between the public administration, businesses, and citizens.

The Bureaucracy Observatory acts as a key pillar within the National Policy on Administrative Procedures. It was established under the Ministry's General Secretariat of Digital Governance and has two mechanisms, namely: the Coordination Mechanism under the Secretariat and the Executive Mechanism in the NDC.

The Observatory is set to play a pivotal role play in modernising the public administration in the Greek public sector, according to the NGEU. In fact, it will act as the go-to hub for documentation and measurement of administrative burdens of public administration procedures.

How did Deloitte help?

Digital transformation in government services backed by NGEU funding

Greece is undergoing an economic restructuring to effectively and sustainably overcome the pandemic crisis. Issues surrounding bureaucracy and administration, and their impact on entrepreneurialism, are being hotly debated. The socioeconomic effects of the pandemic created an opportunity to digitally transform government services, build a broader momentum to reduce red tape and digitalise operations.

The Greek Recovery and Resilience Plan (RRP), or "Greece 2.0" is worth €31 billion. It was funded by the NGEU Programme, and focuses on investing in greener and more digital ways of working, while outlining a significant number of public reforms. One of them focuses on "the development of an open and reusable data governance and policy." This will develop and implement a holistic strategy to reduce administrative burden. This strategy aims to create customer-centric services in public administration by upscaling processes that comply with EU strategies and policies.

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Working together to relieve administrative burdens

The Ministry's most pressing priority is the Observatory's design. They plan to implement a governance scheme and targeting operating model that covers the whole organisation and a wider ecosystem of stakeholders and partners who can efficiently and effectively monitor bureaucracy in Greece. The aim is to simplify procedures involving businesses and/or citizens who use public administration and get tangible results from the Observatory's annual assessment.

The target operating model will measure administrative burdens arising from regulations within the Greek Public Administration. A methodology containing particular policy areas, specific processes and interactions between the public sector, citizens and businesses will be prioritised for simplification.

Deloitte is helping support and create the first Bureaucracy Report that is due in Q2 2023. It will serve as an annual account of how bureaucracy has been minimised and its impact on citizens and businesses' operations.

The main priority is to establish a sustainable Executive Mechanism with a long-term vision. One that will allow the Observatory to become a valuable, government-wide aid that covers all ministries and policy areas, while having a positive impact on Greece.
