- Awardees must maintain a passing grade in Accounting at undergraduate level and continue with a relevant course of study. Deloitte reserves the right to cease payment of the award if the course of study no longer meets criteria.
- Satisfy the criteria specified in the personal impact statement section of the application form

Background information and acknowledgements
