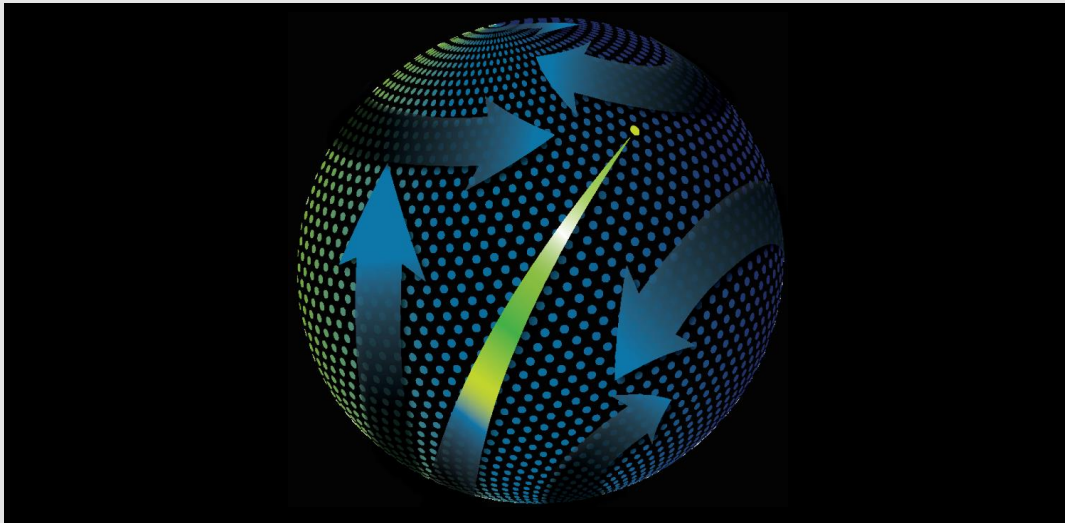

## Myanmar

### Myanmar to reopen land border crossings with China and Thailand

Myanmar has announced that it will reopen land border crossings with China and Thailand by December 2021, ahead of a planned resumption of international air travel by the end of the first quarter of 2022. Travel restrictions will be eased at Muse in Myanmar, which borders Ruili city in China's Yunnan Province, and at the three Myanmar towns of Tachileik, Kawthaung, and Htee Kee, which borders Thailand.

## Singapore

### Singapore to extend vaccinated travel lane (VTL) scheme to India, Indonesia, Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates

Singapore will extend the VTL scheme to India and Indonesia from 29 November 2021, and to Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the United Arab Emirates (UAE) from 6 December 2021.

For now, the upcoming VTL with Indonesia will be a unilateral one. As a start, there will be two daily designated services between Singapore and Jakarta. This will progressively be increased to four.

Applications for short-term visitors and long-term pass holders will start on 22 November 2021 for travellers from India and Indonesia, while travellers from Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE will be able to apply from 29 November 2021. Returning Singapore Citizens and Permanent Residents who are fully vaccinated will not need to apply if they are travelling via the VTL.

- Pre-departure Antigen Rapid Test (ART)\* or PCR test to be conducted within 48 hours of departure
- Seven-day SHN at declared place of accommodation
- SHN exit PCR test on day seven

**Category III**

*Argentina, Bangladesh, Belarus, Brazil, Colombia, Estonia, Kuwait, Lao People's Democratic Republic, Latvia, Lithuania, Mexico, Mongolia, Morocco, Nepal, Oman, Pakistan, Papua New Guinea, Philippines, Romania, Russia, Serbia, Seychelles, Slovenia, Thailand, and Ukraine*

- Travellers are to check the [SafeTravel website](#) for specific entry application requirements
- Pre-departure ART\* or PCR test to be conducted within 48 hours of departure
- 10-day SHN at declared place of accommodation
- SHN exit PCR test on day 10

**Category IV**

*All other countries/regions*

- Travellers are to check the [SafeTravel website](#) for specific entry application requirements
  - Pre-departure PCR test to be conducted within 48 hours of departure

- 10-day SHN at dedicated SHN facility
- SHN exit PCR test on day 10

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**VTL**

*Australia, Brunei, Canada, Denmark, France, Germany, Italy, Netherlands, Spain, South Korea, Switzerland, the United Kingdom, and the United States*

*From 29 November 2021: Finland, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, and Sweden*

*From 6 December 2021: Qatar, Saudi Arabia, and the UAE*

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- Pre-departure ART\* or PCR test to be conducted within 48 hours of departure
- On-arrival PCR test

\* Professionally administered negative ART in English, date of test, traveller's name, and either date of birth or passport number.

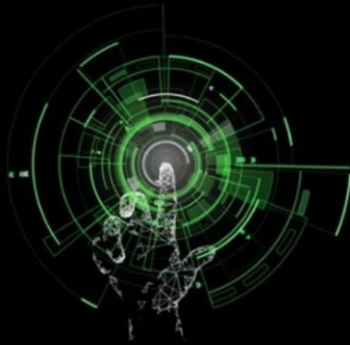
