

## Bangladesh

### International passenger flight operations to/from Bangladesh

Civil Aviation Authority of Bangladesh | 30 April 2021

With effect from 12.01 a.m. (BST) on 1 May 2021 until further notice, scheduled passenger flights between Dhaka and some selected countries shall resume operations as per their approved timeslots under Summer 2021 schedule. All incoming and outgoing passengers, except children below 10 years, shall mandatorily possess a polymerase chain reaction (PCR)-based COVID-19 negative certificate. The PCR test must be done within 72 hours of the flight departure time. All home and institutional quarantine will be administered by the local administration and law enforcing agencies. ## Taiwan

### Entry ban on travellers with history of travel to India

Taiwan Centres for Disease Control | 3 May 2021

With effect from 4 May 2021, Republic of China (R.O.C.) nationals and non-R.O.C. nationals with an Alien Resident Certificate (ARC) who have travelled to India in the past 14 days, including transit, would be required to stay at group quarantine facilities and undergo COVID-19 testing after arrival in Taiwan. R.O.C. nationals and ARC holders will also be subject to another COVID-19 test before the completion of their quarantine period. After they test negative, they must continue to complete a seven-day period of self-health management. Non-R.O.C. nationals without an ARC will be temporarily barred from entering Taiwan.
