

Application for extension of stay by non-permanent residents who are currently outside Hong Kong

Government of the Hong Kong special administrative region | 7 April 2022

The Immigration Department has announced that in view of the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic, a new facilitation measure will be implemented from 8 April 2022 to enable eligible non-permanent residents who are currently outside Hong Kong to apply for an extension of stay. Tentatively, this new measure will be valid until 31 December 2022.

Non-permanent residents whose limit of stay is about to expire (generally within four weeks), but are currently outside Hong Kong may apply for an extension of stay if they are admitted to Hong Kong under the following immigration policies/schemes:

- General Employment Policy (including both employment and investment as entrepreneurs)
- Admission Scheme for Mainland Talents and Professionals
- Quality Migrant Admission Scheme
- Immigration Arrangements for Non-local Graduates
- Admission Scheme for the Second Generation of Chinese Hong Kong Permanent Residents
- Technology Talent Admission Scheme
- Capital Investment Entrant Scheme
- Residence as dependants
- Students enrolled in full-time study programs

Eligible applicants may submit the applications online, or through their sponsors/authorised representatives in Hong Kong in accordance with the prevailing application procedures for an extension of stay.

Myanmar

Public health requirements for travellers entering Myanmar via air transport Ministry of Health | 7 April 2022

With effect from 17 April 2022, travellers entering Myanmar via air transport will be

required to present printed copies of the following documents during the check-in process before boarding, and upon arrival in Myanmar:

- A COVID-19 vaccination certificate showing that they have been fully vaccinated at least 14 days before their arrival in Myanmar, using a vaccine approved by the Ministry of Health (MOH)
- A negative COVID-19 RT-PCR test result issued at most 72 hours before their arrival in Myanmar
- A COVID-19 medical insurance policy purchased from Myanma Insurance (for foreigners only)

Travellers shall submit a Health Declaration Form to the airport health authorities upon arrival, and fulfil the following requirements at their own cost:

- Private transportation from the airport to the designated hotel;
- Stay at a designated hotel until the result of COVID-19 RT-PCR test is available
- A COVID-19 RT-PCR test by a laboratory approved by MOH
