

Bangladesh

Bangladesh lifts COVID-19 curbs

Ongoing restrictions will be eased in Bangladesh from midnight on 14 July 2021 to 6 a.m. on 23 July 2021 to enable pre-Eid-ul-Azha business and trade to take place. Public transportation will operate on a limited scale, while shops, stores, and malls will be allowed to operate under existing health guidelines. After this interval, another session of strict lockdowns will commence from 23 July 2021 onwards.

Government tightens quarantine requirements for persons arriving from Russia

Government of the Hong Kong special administrative region (SAR) | 12 July 2021

With effect from 16 July 2021, the Government will specify Russia as a very high-risk group A2 specified place. All persons who have stayed in any group A2 specified place on the day of boarding or in the 21 days prior will be required to present proof of a negative result for a COVID-19 polymerase chain reaction (PCR) nucleic acid test conducted within 72 hours before their scheduled departure time, as well as confirmation of a room reservation for 21 nights in a designated quarantine hotel in Hong Kong.

Upon arrival in Hong Kong, they will be subject to the “test-and-hold” arrangement at the airport, and on confirmation of negative test results, they will then be required to board the designated transport arranged by the Government to proceed to the designated quarantine hotels for compulsory quarantine. They will be subject to a 21-day compulsory quarantine at designated quarantine hotels, with four tests to be conducted during the period, followed by a seven-day self-monitoring period, and compulsory testing on the 26th day of arrival at any Community Testing Centre.


