

Myanmar

Public health requirements for travellers entering Myanmar

Yangon International Airport | 7 October 2022

With effect from 8 October 2022, travellers entering Myanmar on commercial flights will be required to comply with the following public health requirements:

- Present a COVID-19 vaccination certificate as proof that they have been fully vaccinated at least 14 days prior to arrival in Myanmar, using approved vaccines on the list published by the Ministry of Health; or present a negative COVID-19 reverse transcription-polymerase chain reaction (RT-PCR) result issued at most 48 hours before arrival, if they are unvaccinated or not fully vaccinated;
- Present proof of a COVID-19 medical insurance policy purchased from Myanmar Insurance, if they are foreigners;
- Present a printed copy of all abovementioned documents to airline staff upon flight check-in, and to airport health authorities upon arrival in Myanmar;
- Submit a Health Declaration Form to airport health authorities upon arrival in Myanmar; and
- Undergo a COVID-19 rapid diagnostic test (RDT) at the airport at their own cost (MMK 15,000 per traveller). Travellers who test negative may leave the airport. Travellers who test positive will be immediately isolated and taken to a medical facility or designated hotel in accordance with existing health protocols.

Vaccination requirements to apply for and renew MOM passes

Ministry of Manpower | 13 October 2022

All foreigners aged 13 and above who are applying for new passes must be fully vaccinated with WHO EUL vaccines (including booster, if eligible) to get their passes issued.

Work Permit and S Pass holders must also be fully vaccinated with WHO EUL vaccines (including booster dose, if eligible), before they can renew their passes if they are either of the following:

- Employed in the Construction, Marine Shipyard or Process sectors
- Staying in dormitories

The booster dose must be taken within 270 days from their last primary vaccination dose.

Foreigners who received their vaccinations in Singapore should have their vaccination status reflected in their HealthHub or TraceTogether app. Foreigners who were vaccinated overseas must verify their overseas vaccination records by taking a serology test, or getting their [digitally-verifiable vaccination certificates](#) (DVCs) verified at a local [clinic](#) .



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
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
