## Short Course on: Compliance and Valuation in the Minerals Industry

### BRIEF DESCRIPTION

This course provides insight into the practical application and understanding of key points of the Mineral resource estimation code that influence the reporting of technical and economic information for Mineral Resource Assets and companies both in the public and private sector. It combines the issues relating to technical definitions of mineral assets, security exchange requirements, valuation standards and mineral accounting factors
